One such fixture will be a new walkway that will be constructed through the campus. Contributors at the \$150 level or higher can be commemorated by inscriptions on the bricks that will lay out the walkway.

TECHnicallySpeaking@ ameritech.net I attended Tech from January 1926 until my graduation in June 1929. I had many great teachers, but one stands out above all the others: CYRUS N. LANCASTER. I was in his Algebra and Physics classes.

My father was ill during most of my high school career and died in April 1929 just two months before my graduation. When the Depression followed in the fall of 1929, my mother and I had a tough time.

During those tough years, Mr. Lancaster kept his eye on Mother and me and helped wherever he could. I remember one occasion when I had to go to the hospital for an appendectomy. Mother was worried about how to get me home from the hospital. Mr. Lancaster recruited another Tech teacher. They drove me home and carried me into the house on a chair.

In the years since, I have managed to write four books for the Bobbs-Merrill Company in their "Childhood of Famous Americans" series. They especially wanted me to write a book on Albert Einstein, and I often think how helpful those classes in Physics were that I took at Tech from Mr. Lancaster.
