A Tale of Three Techites

Arsenal Technical High School has been educating the citizens of Indianapolis since 1912, and its students and graduates walk forth from those familiar gates to impact our neighborhoods and our world. Three of our fellow Techites are profiled briefly below, highlighting their achievements in the areas of Art, Athletics and Business.

ART

Robert [Clark] Indiana, Class of 1946, became interested in Art during his years at Tech. After a stint in the Army Air Corps, he attended the Art Institute of Chicago, graduating in 1953. He studied in Europe for several years, and then returned to the United States. Upon his return to America, he began to work with signs and symbols, incorporating them into his art work.



During the 1960s, Mr. Indiana created one of his most famous works, the *LOVE* paintings and sculptures that came to symbolize the "Make Love, Not War" movement of that time. His *LOVE* sculpture currently graces the grounds of the Indianapolis Museum of Art.

Last year, Mr. Indiana was commissioned to create a signature sculpture for the dramatic atrium space of the new Indiana State Museum in downtown Indianapolis. The result is *Indiana*, a 55-foot high obelisk (pictured, left), rendered in the traditional blue and gold of the Indiana state flag.

ATHLETICS

Corey Cole, Tech senior, is a dedicated athlete on Tech's swim team. Most of his days include 3 hours or more of diving practice. He travels all over the Midwest, competing with the Indiana Stars, an elite diving team. He also participates in a local acrobatic group known as the Jireh Sports Airborne Acrobats.

Corey is a mild-mannered and gentle-spirited young man. He has been raised by his grandmother from age two. Although life has not been easy for Corey, he perseveres by staying focused on his dreams. Many are now saying that, if Corey continues to improve at his current rate, he may become the first African-American to compete on the U.S. Olympic Diving Team.


BUSINESS

Duane Blankenhorn 1934—2000 Class of 1952 It is difficult to find anyone associated with Tech High School who is not familiar with the name of **Duane Blankenhorn**. They may have known him as a classmate, or as history teacher, guidance counselor, athletic ticket manager, or aide to the Tech Speech team. Or perhaps they had known him as a member of the Tech Alumni Association, who later became its President, and actively served on its Scholarship Selection Committee; or as member and past-President of the Tech Retired Teachers Association.

Duane Blankenhorn served Tech, its teachers, faculty, staff, and students in any and every way that he could. His dedication to Tech and its ideals was unsurpassed. After Duane's passing following a brief illness in June, 2000, Tech High School and the Tech Alumni Association sought to design and place a suitable remembrance of Duane on the campus of the school that he loved so much and to which he dedicated his life.



In September, 2001, a memorial bench was placed on Tech's campus, just outside the Arsenal Building. Its inscription reads, "Duane K. Blankenhorn Counselor, Teacher, Friend and Alumnus." The next time you are on Tech's campus, seek out Duane's bench, sit for a while and marvel at the beauty of the campus, and remember all that Duane was able to contribute through his service to Tech.

Tech Athletic Hall of Fame Inducts 10



Tech Student Shares Her Experience as a Congressional Page

During the month of June, 2001, I earned a chance to have a wonderful experience being a Congressional Page in the U.S. House of Representatives, thanks to Congresswoman Julia Carson, the Tech Alumni Association, and others. The experience of being on the House floor was worth it alone, not to mention exploring D.C. and having the experience of being on my own for a month. It was amazing.

Before I was able to go to Washington, D.C., I had to go through the whole interview and filling out paper process, not to mention trying to raise enough money to go. I was the only person from Indiana to go. There were teenagers from all over the United States that were chosen to be one of the lucky ones. We lived in dorms, like those in college, a boys' floor and a girls'. Everyone was roomed with someone from another state. My roommates were from Ohio and California. It was amazing to see how everyone interacted with one another, and, even though we came from different backgrounds and had different accents, we still came together as though we went to the same school.

Every day we all got dressed in our uniforms, which consisted of blue blazers, gray pants/skirts and a striped tie, then walked to work. There were two different jobs. One was being a runner, in which we were basically being assistants to the Representatives. We went to the different offices of the Congressmen and women picked up packages. Then we delivered them to their destinations. We also picked up and delivered flags. Before I went I didn't know this, but Congressmen and women will buy a flag and have it flown over the House of Representatives. It will then come back with a certificate to whomever they choose stating that it has been flown over the House. Doing this signifies an honor to whoever receives the flag.

The other type of job a page would have is being in the cloakroom. When you are in the cloakroom you answer the phones and deliver the messages to the Congressmen and women while they're on the House floor. This job is a little harder because you have to learn and remember all of the names and faces of your Representatives. We were divided up into the Republican and Democratic pages—the political party of your sponsor determined which side you ended up on.

We worked nine to five, Monday through Friday. During our runs we used the tunnels a lot. The tunnels run under the House to the other three office buildings. We had to use them so much because it was very hot outside, and if we would have gone outside someone could have had a heat stroke. The tunnels were confusing at first, but after being in them a couple of times it wasn't so bad (at least they were air-conditioned).

As for the political side of my trip, I learned a whole lot. I really didn't know very much about politics before I took my trip, but learned a lot while I was there. I had never watched C-Span before, so I had no idea how everything worked. Every morning they would start with a prayer, and the saying of the Pledge of Allegiance. This would be followed by minutes. Every representative then had a chance to talk about anything they wanted to for a couple of minutes. (There was one person who stood out, Congressman Traficant. His speeches were very funny.) After this they would be adjourned until later.

They usually did votes in the afternoon. One day they did a vote and the Democrats were winning so some of the Republicans went around telling other Republicans to switch their votes. As a result, they did and the Republicans won. In order to vote, the Representatives have a card they put in a slot and push either the yes or no button. Their vote is then indicated on a big screen on the wall above the speaker's chair. These are just a few of the many things I learned about how Congress works.

I also did a bit of sightseeing. I could do a lot of that at work. The Capitol building is an artwork all its own. There is artwork everywhere: statues, paintings (both on the wall and ceiling), plus the structure on its own is a piece of work.

Overall it was a wonderful experience for me, and I would recommend it to anyone who is interested in politics or how the government works. One can learn a lot as a Congressional Page.

Civil War era, has been restored on the exterior, with the interior transformed into a beautiful visitors' center.


On Alumni Day, June 15, following a brief ribbon-cutting ceremony, many alumni and other dignitaries toured the newly renovated Guard House.


