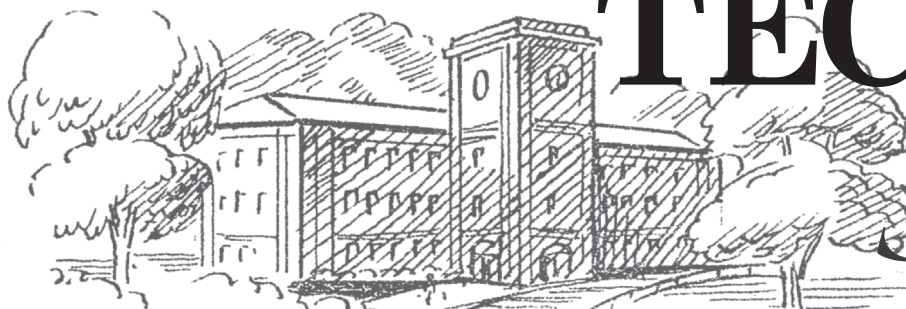

The Web site will be a place to learn about Tech and stay up-to-date on alumni activities. It features an interactive event calendar that

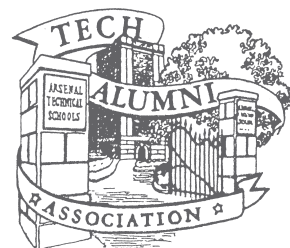
will be updated regularly, a merchandise page and donation forms.

Errors & Omissions

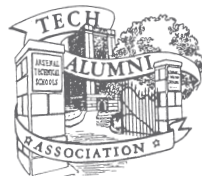

After nearly a decade of student voices being silenced on Tech's campus, Student Council has plans to change that.

There were four call-outs for Student Council last year, but because it was January, there was a delayed interest.

Some goals for Student Council include promoting student involvement and approaching issues facing the student body.

Student Council's first order of business is to address plans for this year's graduation ceremony. The group is also planning a school dance that will take place sometime this fall.

McKeith Pearson, a junior in the Magnet Academy was elected president Sept. 30.

"I have passion. Without trying, how can we say it's not going to be done?" Pearson said. "As president, I will not classify you by your academy; we are all here for the same purpose."

Ciara Spivey, a sophomore in the Life Long Learners Academy, joined Student Council as an attempt to create more school activities.

"Tech lacks spirit; we need to spice things up a little and make it more interesting," Spivey said.

The Legacy Project: Coming to a campus near you

As Tech approaches its centennial, a new legacy is being born that will change the face of campus for the next 100 years.

The merging of Tech's centennial and Indianapolis hosting the Super Bowl is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, said Tracy Heaton, executive associate of the Legacy Project of the John H. Boner Community Center.

Tech's campus will be home to a 27,000-square-foot, \$11.2 million Near Eastside Legacy Center. The Legacy Center will have a gymnasium, kitchens, a yoga room, a greenhouse, a studio (sound), a fitness center, classroom and activity space and technical lab space.

"The Near Eastside Legacy Center is bringing positive attention to Tech High School and to the Near Eastside community," Heaton said. "The building will be LEED certified, reflecting the values of both IPS and the nearby community to support our environment."

The building process of the Legacy Center starts in October, and it will be located where the baseball diamond is now and the baseball diamond will be moved to the old Twin-Aire Drive-in site.

This new building will bring new programming and opportunities to the Tech campus.

"It will have assets not currently found elsewhere on the Tech campus or in the community," Heaton said.

Although the services will be mostly available to the children in after-school programs through the Boner Center, current Tech programs could also schedule use of the building to better their programs.

The new Near Eastside Legacy Center will eventually be given to IPS, but the operation of the building will remain a joint partnership between the Boner Community Center and IPS for decades.

"This new building is one more reason why Tech is such an amazing, special, one-of-a-kind campus," Heaton said.

About 90 percent of the cost for the Legacy Project has been raised in pledges and grant money from private funding. State Farm loaned \$7 million to the Legacy Project. The National Football League contributed \$1 million, the Metropolitan Board of Realtors contributed \$500,000 to renovate 30 vacant homes and build two new houses with \$2.5 million to come from the city, who will make a total contribution of \$4.8 million.

"It is exciting for me personally to play a small part in bringing this asset to the community and to my local public high school," Heaton said.

More than just a club
