Centennial Celebration Leaves Lasting Impression

Tech's 100th birthday was filled with fun, laughter, music, and ceremony! The entire Centennial week was a great success, culminating in a joyous weekend of festivities. Even the weather celebrated with us, as it was a perfect weekend for the Homecoming game and all the Saturday activities.

The fun kicked off Wednesday, with a student assembly where a snapshot of Tech's 100 years was presented, the school songs were sung and staff alumni were introduced. The highlight was the presentation of a "birthday cake", built in the shape of the Arsenal, with 100 flaming candles atop the roof. The lovely cake had been built by Kevin Brewer ('72), and Tech's stage crew. The students sang "Happy Birthday" to Tech and blew out the candles!

Centennial weekend kicked off right after school with an alumni tailgating event. The stadium parking lot was filled with grads and grills and tents and posters. The festive ambiance of the tailgating party set the mood for the entire weekend!

The 60s majorettes turned back the clock and still had their "moves"—and a few even wore their sequin vests! Other alumni sported Tech attire or bought the souvenirs on sale, including "Greenclads" and "Titans" sweatshirts from the Alumni Tent, where everyone registered. The Centennial tee shirts were almost an instant sell-out. School spirit was everywhere!

The alumni took an entire section under the press box for the game and cheered on our Titans. The homecoming royalty was crowned by Laurie Lewis Wood ('72), who won the Queen crown 40 years ago. She was escorted by Tech principal Larry Yarrell ('75). The team didn't bring us a victory, but the spirit and fun created a winning evening anyway!

Saturday was the big day! A great parade stepped off, led by Grand Marshall Howard Catt, Tech's long-time athletic director, at 10 a.m. They were followed by The Marching Titans, with new band director Brandon Anderson, and many floats, clubs, vintage cars carrying distin-

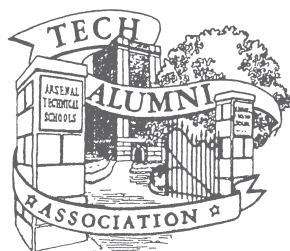
guished alumni and other units.

The parade wound up at the stadium, where we commenced at noon with the official celebration. Speakers included IPS Superintendent Dr. Eugene White, ATHS Alumni Association president Ron Jackson, and principal Larry Yarrell, who also read the proclamation from the Mayor citing September 12, 2012, as "Arsenal Technical High School Day". The birthday cake was presented, we all sang "Happy Birthday" and made a wish for Tech's next 100 years as we blew out the candles.

The culminating event was the dinner dance at Valle Vista on Saturday night, which was a huge success. The dance floor was totally rocking, packed with 20-somethings to 80-somethings! Several folks commented that they'd "never seen a dance like this before," as the age differences melted away with the decades-spanning music. No one wanted the fantastic evening, or weekend, to end.

A Message from the Alumni Association

Greetings Tech Alumni!

Your Tech Alumni Association is seeking those alumni who desire to “give back to Tech” and serve either on the board of directors or in a support role on a committee.

The term of office is one year beginning in June. The board meets nine times each year on the second Tuesday of the month, except for July, August & December. Committees meet on an as-needed basis.

Following is a brief description of the positions, responsibilities and ideal experience:

PRESIDENT Presides & creates meeting agendas; contacts award candidates; coordinates, writes & prints award programs and presides at award functions; oversees all board function & policy; represents the Alumni Association when necessary

VICE PRESIDENT Supports the president and is ready to fill in at any time.

TREASURER Typical bookkeeping and accounting practices; handles all assets & liabilities; manages all revenue, assets and investments; plus chairs the Revenue & Investment Committee

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY Manages and maintains the membership database; receives all incoming correspondence; maintains records & yearbook inventory; acknowledges all major donors

RECORDING SECRETARY Records and prepares the minutes for board meetings

FINANCE Chairs the Endowment Fund Grant Committee; coordinates, researches and reviews all grant requests; provides appropriate documentation to Treasurer for approved grant payments

WAYS & MEANS Researches, purchases and inventories all Tech branded clothing and merchandise for awards and resale. Manages sales of merchandise at Alumni Day and other events & activities

NEWSLETTER & WEBSITE Editor for Technically Speaking newsletter; oversees newsletter printing & mailing; oversees & manages content for website

SCHOLARSHIPS Manages student interviews; oversees scholarship grants; helps student, parent and college coordination; manages scholarship grant payments

REUNION COORDINATOR Helps class leaders with reunions; coordinates lunch, awards and photographer for Alumni Day; provide ideas to make Alumni Day more exciting, memorable and alluring.

ON-CAMPUS LIAISON Current or former Tech teacher helps coordinate Alumni Association activities & events with Tech's calendar

PUBLIC RELATIONS Experienced writers, artists, marketing or advertising professionals

REVENUE & INVESTMENT COMMITTEE Need experienced alumni from business, fund raising, finance or investment world (personal or professional)

ENDOWMENT FUND GRANT COMMITTEE Need experienced teachers from alumni to meet with Tech faculty, analyze grant requests and make recommendations

Annual Alumni Day Awards

If you are aware of any candidate who fits the criteria of any of the following Alumni Association Awards, please send us their contact information and any resume information you feel justifies their recognition. Thank you!

ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR AWARD (Started in 1972)

This award is given annually in June, at Tech's campus on Alumni Day, to a living graduate who has demonstrated outstanding performance in their endeavor to succeed in their chosen field and in community service, in either local or national activities. The recipient must be present on Alumni Day in order to be eligible to receive this award.

WALLY POTTER MEMORIAL AWARD (Started in 2010)

Wally Potter was a 1940 graduate of Tech who returned to Tech to teach and coach for 31 years from 1949 until his retirement in 1980. He was inducted into the Indianapolis Public School Hall of Fame in 1986. No one gave more of themselves to Tech High School in their lifetime than Wallace Reid Potter.

Recipients of this award are evaluated on this criteria: a) must be a Tech graduate, b) must have played a sport, coached or been involved in the Tech Athletic program in some way, c) has supported the Tech Athletic program, Tech Academic program, or ATHS Alumni Association activities in some way since their graduation, d) must be present at Alumni Day to receive the award. This award is given annually in June on Alumni Day at the Tech campus.

DUANE BLANKENHORN AWARD (Started in 2002)

Duane Blankenhorn was a 1952 graduate of Tech, a teacher, counselor, and a dedicated long time member of the Arsenal Technical Alumni Board, serving in a number of capacities. This award was established to honor Duane and is given to an ATHS Alumni Board member who has served on the alumni board for at least 5 years as an officer or in a position of responsibility. The award is given annually on Alumni Day in June at the Tech Campus. The recipient must be present in order to be eligible to receive this award.

KARL J. STIPHER AWARD (Started in 1987)

Karl J. Stipher was a 1931 graduate of Tech, the first Alumni Association President, and a long time member of the Arsenal Technical High School Alumni Board. This award was established to recognize people, whether they are a graduate or not, who have dedicated themselves to Arsenal Technical High School. Recipients must have had a positive influence on Tech in many aspects, worked with students, or made contributions in several other areas. This award is given annually in June on Alumni Day. The recipient must be present on Alumni Day in order to be eligible to receive this award.

HONORARY TECH GRADUATE AWARD (Started 1993)

Periodically, when a candidate(s) is identified, this award is given to one or more people who did not attend or graduate from Tech High School, but who have made significant contributions to Tech High School and/or to the ATHS Alumni Association. This award may be given annually in June on Alumni Day and the recipient must be present in order to be eligible to receive this award.

MISCELLANEOUS ALUMNI AWARDS

HANSON H. ANDERSON AWARD (Started in 1971)

Hanson H. Anderson was one of the eight original faculty members when Tech opened in 1912. He later became head of the math department and was principal from 1937-1958. While at Tech, he built a reputation for excellence, both professionally and personally. His ideals were the highest, his leadership confident, his discipline firm, and his friendship warm and abiding. He was respected and beloved by faculty and students alike as he pursued the goal of developing in Tech a high school that would prepare students for both advanced education and life's experiences.


Recipients of the Hanson H. Anderson Award are selected on the basis of those qualities that Mr. Anderson personified outstanding personal achievement, success in some area of their lives and community service. This award is usually presented at a noon luncheon on the Tech campus sometime in January each year. Recipients must be present.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS AWARD (Started in 1988)

This award is given annually to a maximum of twelve living Tech graduates who have been successful in various aspects of life, served as a good role model, made contributions to Tech High School, their community or nation and/or continued an interest in the education process. These awards are presented on the Tech campus each year after a date and forum has been determined. Recipients must be present to be eligible.

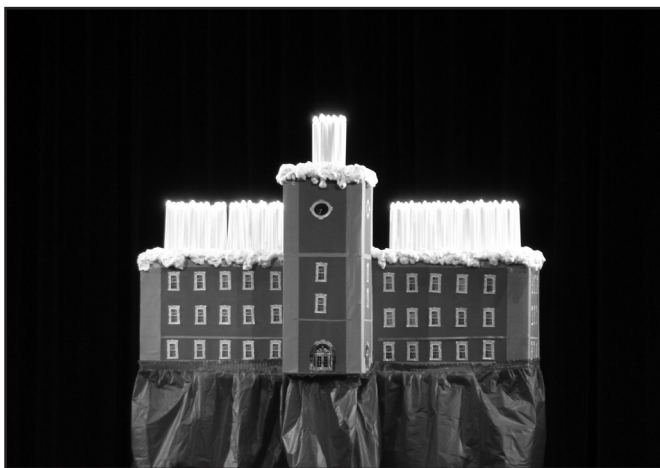
