2014 Hanson H. Anderson Award Winners

On January 16, 2014, three outstanding Tech graduates were awarded the Hanson H. Anderson award in a ceremony held on the Tech Campus. This year's recipients were Richard L. Buchanan (1964), Clifford Chandler (1964), and Edward L. West (1954). All three have achieved success professionally while also giving back through community service and civic involvement. Congratulations to the 2014 recipients!

Ric Buchanan had a successful career as an attorney in Ohio while also co-founding the Human Rights Bar Association in Ohio and serving on the Board of Trustees of Caracole House, the first AIDS hospice in Cincinnati. Ric has served as the executive director the Al-Anon Family Group Headquarters since 1996.

Cliff Chandler was a successful accountant and auditor before becoming the owner of Indy's Music House with his wife from 1986 to 2001. Cliff retired in 2013 after serving as an accountant for the Christian Church Foundation. Additionally, Cliff started the Internal Audit Department for the City of Indianapolis.

Ed West began his career as a carpenter and assistant superintendant at K and P Building. He moved on to Merchants Bank (later National City Bank) where he retired in 2004 as a Senior Vice President. Ed has been a member of the Indianapolis Board of Realtors since 1965 and currently serves on the Board of Damar Services.

Named for Hanson H. Anderson, one of the eight original faculty members when Tech opened in 1912, this award is given annually to three to five alumni. Recipients are selected on the basis of those qualities that Mr. Anderson personified, outstanding personal achievement, success in some area of their lives and community service.

A Message from the Alumni Association President

Greetings to Techites, wherever you might be,

Here's an update on our new Buy-A-Brick Endowment Fund Campaign that we kicked off in last spring's issue of Technically Speaking.

At this time (off to a slow start) we have only received \$21,007.00 in donations from about 45 Tech alumni who want to preserve their names in Tech's rich history in the new Alumni Plaza on the Tech campus.

If you plan to record your name in Tech's history, please don't wait any longer. Most of our alumni response has come from the 1930s, 1940s and 1950s, representing 83% of our donations. We have heard from only 12 alumni from the 1960s, only 2 alumni from the 1970s and NO ONE from the 1980s through 2013.

So far, 30 alumni classmates have purchased a brick; some at the TECH LEGION recognition level of \$500 for a large brick, but most at the HONOR SOCIETY recognition level of \$200 for the regular size brick. Five Tech alums have made donations at the DEAN'S LIST recognition level of \$1,000 and one alumnus made a donation at the PRINCIPAL'S CIRCLE recognition level of \$10,000.

Another group of alumni have not purchased bricks, but have made smaller donations in order to help cover some of the costs, which we appreciate very much.

Some alumni cannot donate the entire recognition level amount in one lump sum, so they choose to pledge weekly or monthly payments over time. We also can accept credit cards for donations. Just let us know whatever donation plan you choose.

We have the space for hundreds of bricks in the Alumni Plaza for the TECH LEGION (\$500) and HONOR SOCIETY levels, but we are limited to 7 more names in the ARSENAL SOCIETY level (\$25,000) and 4 more names in the PRINCIPAL'S CIRCLE level (\$10,000). There is space for 27 names in both the VALEDICTORIAN level (\$5,000) and the SALUTATORIAN level (\$2,500). At the DEAN'S LIST level (\$1,000) we have space for about 45 names.

So don't be left out. Send in your donation and accomplish 3 things: 1- preserve your name in Tech's history for all time, 2- help keep the Tech Alumni Association strong and active, 3- express your gratitude for what Tech has given to you by supporting other students and their opportunities.

We would love to place our order and have the new Alumni Plaza and all of the new names finished and in place by the end of next summer, 2015.

New "Alumni Plaza"


We plan to redesign, enlarge and enhance our Alumni Recognition Area, (abutting the walk across from Hanson H Anderson Auditorium). This area will be a beautiful and important site for preserving names and class history for all students, returning alumni and their families and friends.

This new recognition Area will be known as the "Alumni Plaza" and will feature two distinguished brick "Towers of Honor" providing various sizes of limestone plaques with etched names and class years on them. The floor of this

area will be inlaid with the same regular and larger bricks that are in place in the existing recognition area.

Hundreds of Tech alumni have already preserved their names in history by purchasing bricks and/or recognition through the original levels of donor participation. It has been very beneficial for Tech, its students and Alumni for over a decade.

The names etched on the glass block wall in the current Alumni Recognition Area will be re-etched on limestone plaques and/or attached to the appropriate brick "Tower of Honor", according to the level of the donation, at no cost. The existing bricks will also be reused



and relaid in their same locations. New bricks will be added as they are sold. Special green bricks will also be laid to create a large 'Block T' design in the middle of the floor.

No matter the level of your original donation, it will be preserved in the new recognition plan without additional cost or effort on the part of the original donors. Tech's beautiful tradition and academic excellence will be reflected in the design and materials for generations to appreciate and remember.

The existing wooden recognition plaques hanging on the wall in the Arsenal will be updated and redone as needed too.

All donor recognition will now conform to our newly formatted seven do-nor levels and be recognized in the Alumni Plaza and in the Arsenal building. The new Alumni Plaza will become the primary focus for recognizing distinguished alumni for all future generations.
