# Tech's Campus Enters New Millennium

Alumni Classes of 1950 and 1951 Spearhead Restoration Efforts

Tech's beautiful campus is being transformed for the new millennium, thanks to the vision, donations and support of Tech's alumni.

#### **Arsenal Bell Tower Restoration**

As reported in the November 2000 issue of *TECHnically Speaking*, the **Class of 1950** recently completed their ambitious project of restoring the bell tower in the Arsenal Building. This project included restoration of the bell and the clock faces, and lighting the tower from dusk until dawn. The project was completed in time for Alumni Day 2000, and the bell rang out over the festivities to the delight of the 500 guests in attendance.

#### **Guard House Restoration**

The Class of 1951 will be celebrating its 50th reunion this June. To commemorate this special occasion, the class hopes to present a gift of appreciation to the



school and to the community it serves—the restoration of the Guard House at 1500 East Michigan Street. It is the building that most students, teachers and visitors first see as they enter the Tech High School campus.

The Guard House is worthy of its status as an historic landmark, with its origin in the Civil War era. The goal is the restoration of both the exterior and the interior, which will serve as a visitor's center. It will be a place where groups or individuals could meet with a guide who would discuss the history of Tech and its listing on the National Register of Historic Places, and take interested parties on a tour of the Tech campus.

Members of the Class of 1951 are asking for donations for the Guard House Restoration Project, and hope that other "reunion classes" or other individuals will contribute to the effort. All former Tech students and friends of Tech are invited to participate.

Alumni are asked to give serious consideration to supporting this project financially. The level of support from Tech alumni and interested individuals is a powerful incentive to philanthropic organizations capable of funding a significant portion of the cost of restoration. Several grant applications have already been filed, and are in the process of review.

Realization of the Guard House Restoration will make Tech's entry into the new millennium very special for everyone involved. The total project cost is \$154,210.

There are other projects that the school and interested alumni have begun discussing as possible projects for the future. They include:

- A new west entrance plaza to the Tech football stadium, including new restrooms, a concession stand, and handicap accessibility.
- Replacement of the carillon in Stuart Hall.

# Jack Aldridge Scholarship Award Established

Members of the class of 1948, the Tech Alumni Board, and the Tech Athletic Department would like to honor a former Tech athlete with a scholarship in his memory.

Jack Aldridge was a graduate of the Tech class of 1948. While at Tech, Jack lettered in basketball and track. He attended Butler University, and then was called to serve in the Korean conflict. After serving 4 years in the USAF, he returned to Butler, where he graduated with a B.A. in Education. He did his student teaching at Tech, under the tutelage of Wally Potter.

Jack relocated to Arizona where he began teaching, and obtained his M.A. degree from Arizona State University. He rose to prominence in the field of education and retired as Superintendent of Schools of Dateland, AZ. Jack was a proud Tech alumnus, and was honored as an outstanding Tech graduate in February, 2000. We regret to report that Mr. Aldridge passed away on January 1, 2001.

With this scholarship, we will honor a Tech senior athlete who displays good citizenship, scholastic and athletic ability. We will present a plaque, a short biography about Jack, and a cash scholarship.



# Tech Alumni to Honor Two Grads as Alumni of the Year

# Frank E. Morton (1950)



At Tech, Frank Morton participated in track as a pole-vaulter and played on the basketball team. In pole-vaulting, he was city champion, Indianapolis relays champion and sectional champion. As a basketball player, he was on the 1950 team that won the regional championship and played in the

semi-finals. Other activities at Tech included Tech Choir and membership in the Block T Club.

After graduation from Tech, he attended Indiana University Extension while serving a typesetting apprenticeship at Weimer Typesetting. Frank was with the company for forty-two years, becoming its president in 1962. He retired in 1992.

During his business years he was a member of the Advertising Club, a board member of the Printing Industries of Indiana, president of the Art Director's Club of Indiana, a member of the International Typographic Composition Association for over fifty years, and served on its board. He also served on the Indianapolis American Red Cross Public Relations Advisory Committee for over ten years.

Frank is a charter member of King of Glory Lutheran Church in Carmel and served as secretary of the council. He is a founding member of the Hawthorns Country Club, and a member of the Tech Guys Group.

He received recognition in 1992 as a Distinguished Tech Alumnus, and received a Hanson H. Anderson Silver Medal in 1994. During this same period he was privileged to help send the Tech Marching Band to the Peach Bowl, and to help obtain uniforms for the boys' and girls' track teams, and robes for the Techoir. On Alumni Day 2000, he received the Alumni Association's Karl Stipher Award.

Frank was married to Nancy Snyder Morton ('50) for thirty-four years and they had three children. Nancy died of cancer in 1984. He is now married to Susan, who has three children. They have eleven grandchildren.

Frank has taken up golf since retirement and enjoys playing in the Indianapolis area in the summer, and in Florida during the winter months.

## Rolla E. McAdams (1950)



Rolla McAdams graduated from Tech in 1950. While at Tech, he was active in the Service Club and ROTC. He is a graduate of the Indiana Business College, the Executive Development Program at Indiana University, and the Earlham College Executive Management Program. After serving in the U.S. Army from

1952 until 1954, he began working at Reilly Industries (formerly known as Reilly Tar and Chemical), and continued there until his retirement in 1995.

In his 40 years at Reilly Industries, he served in many capacities, including: Vice-Chairman, Executive Vice President, Treasurer, and Chief Financial Officer. Also, a member of the Board of Directors (1974-1995), Chairman of the Pension and Retirement Committees, Chairman and Trustee of the Reilly Foundation, and President of Reibelco SA.

Some of his current activities include: Trustee, Faith United Church of Christ; Member, St. Francis Healthcare Foundation; board member, Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra; Member, Regional Board of Directors, St. Francis Hospital Centers.

In recent years he has also served as: Chairman and Treasurer, Annual Fund—Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra; Chairman, Junior Achievement of Central Indiana; and Trustee/Vice-Chairman, Franklin College.

Mr. McAdams has been recognized by Tech High School and others with numerous awards. 1983: Paul Harris Fellow, Rotary Foundation International. 1988: Indiana Jefferson Award, *Indianapolis Star*, National Bronze Leadership Award, Junior Achievement, Inc. 1997: Life Leadership Hall of Fame, Ruth Lilly Center. 1998: Lifetime Achievement Award Philanthropy, National Society Fundraising Executives; Distinguished Hoosier. 1999: Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters, Eden Theological Seminary. 2000: Distinguished Graduate, Tech Alumni Association.





# 2001 Stipher Award Winner: Michael R. Cecil

Each year, the Tech Alumni Association searches for an individual who exemplifies service to Tech as did our first Alumni Association President, **Karl Stipher**. The Stipher Award, given each year in his honor, goes to a Tech alumnus, teacher or other individual who works to improve the quality of education and quality of life for Tech students, and to perpetuate the fine reputation of Arsenal Technical High School.



On Alumni Day 2001, the Alumni Association will proudly present this honor to Mr. Michael R. Cecil of Tech's Business Education Department. A graduate of Scecina Memorial High School in Indianapolis, with degrees from the University of Indianapolis and Indiana University, Mr. Cecil has taught in the Business Education Department at Tech since 1970. He has also taught Business Education courses in the Tech Evening School, and Driver Education classes in summer school.

In addition to his teaching activities, Mr. Cecil has served as the faculty advisor for the Student Affairs Organization, athletic trainer for all of Tech's athletic teams, co-advisor of the Arsenal Cannon yearbook, Treasurer of the PTSA, and chairman of the Tech Social Activities committee.

His professional contributions include serving on the Indianapolis Business Education Council and the Indiana Business Education Association, the Indiana Vocational Association, the IPS Business Education Advisory Committee, and the Indiana Council of Educators For and About Business.

In recognition of his many contributions to the Tech Community, Mr. Cecil received a community service award from the United Church of Christ; has been an IPS Teacher of the Year finalist; has been nominated as the Outstanding Classroom Teacher of the year by the Indiana Business Education Association; has received the Kiwanis Community Service Award; and has been honored as Tech's Teacher of the Year.

"I believe that my greatest contribution to Arsenal Technical High School has been my effort to gear the classes I teach to the needs and abilities of Tech students, without compromising standards. This effort has required me to develop new classes and to write and produce original classroom materials. Throughout the years, many of the students with whom I have worked have been successful in academic and vocational competitions while in school and have become productive citizens using the knowledge and skills they learned while enrolled in the Business Education Department."

We offer our thanks and congratulations to Mr. Cecil, our 2001 Stipher Award winner.

# 12 Alumni Honored on Tech Leadership Night

The Tech Media Center was the setting for the thirteenth annual Tech Community Leadership Night, held February 16, 2001. After a reception and program which recognized distinguished Tech Alumni and awarded scholarships to several Tech seniors, the program moved to the gymnasium for the Tech/Broad Ripple varsity basketball game. During half time of the game, honor students from community elementary schools, junior high schools and Tech High School were also honored.


