Joyce Taylor Jackson graduated from Tech in 1955. While at Tech, Joyce served on the SAO Board, was co-president of the Tech Choir, an ROTC Sponsor, a Captain of the Tech Legion, and represented Tech at the Bellamy Flag Award ceremony in Chicago.

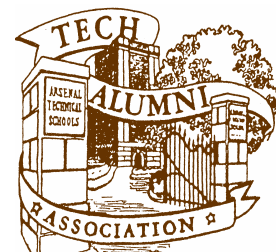
Joyce and Ethan have been married 47 years. They have three sons—Blake, Wessley, and Kyle, who are all involved in the business. They also have nine grandchildren.

John Kanouse is 2007 Stipher Award Winner



John Kanouse graduated from Tech in 1956. He then went on to earn an A. B. degree in History and Political Science from Indiana Central College (now University of Indianapolis) in 1960. He did his graduate work at Bulter University, receiving his M.A. in History and Political Science in 1967.

John taught Social Studies and Spanish at Perry Central High School, Boone County, from 1960-1963. He started teaching at Tech in 1963, where he taught Social Studies, and was Tech's Social Studies Department Head from 1989 until his retirement in 2001. He has always been active in his church and the community. At East Tenth Street United Methodist Church, he has served as Lay Leader and Church Council Chairman. He served as a board member of the Near Eastside Community Organization from 1989-2001. He was the Tech Athletic Hall of Fame Committee's chairman from 2002-2005.

Some of the awards Mr. Kanouse has received: Near Eastside Community Organization—Ruth Shaw Lifetime Achievement Award; Tech High School—H. H. Anderson Award, Athletic Department Lifetime Service Award, Distinguished Graduate Award. On Alumni Day, 2007, John will be honored as the 2007 recipient of the Alumni Association's Karl Stipher Award, for his significant service to Tech High School.

John and his wife **Carolyn Auter Kanouse ('58)** have one son, **Steven Kanouse ('86)**. John is a bluegrass music fan, and a fan of basketball and baseball.
