Felson Bowman Named 2008 Alumnus of the Year



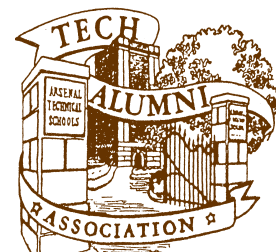
Felson Bowman graduated from Tech High School in 1958. While a student at Tech, Felson participated in football, track and wrestling. He lettered in football, played on the 1958 undefeated football team and served as its co-captain. Upon graduation, Felson attended Northwestern University and Butler University. He graduated from Butler with a Bachelor of Science Degree and from Indiana University School of Law with a Doctor of Jurisprudence Degree.

From 1961-1968, Felson was employed by the Marion County Sheriff's Office and rose to the rank of Captain. Since that time he has practiced law with Lewis, Bowman, St. Clair & Wagner. In 1974, he formed Solar Sources, Inc., which is now the largest privately owned coal mining company in the State of Indiana. He has served and continues to serve as the President and Chairman of the Board for Solar Sources.

Felson was admitted to practice law in Indiana, the Federal Court, Southern District of Indiana, the United States 7th Circuit Court of Appeals and the Supreme Court of the United States. He has presented to the United States Supreme Court and is a member of the Indianapolis and Indiana Bar Associations. He has served as a member and Chairman of the Indiana State Police Board. He has also represented Solar Sources as a member of the Indiana Coal Council for many years and has served as its Chairman on two occasions. Felson has been appointed twice by a governor of Indiana to serve on Energy Policy and Coal Mining Advisory Boards.

Felson attends Mount Pleasant Christian Church. He also continues his interest in Tech High School athletics and has participated in fundraising activities for Tech High School. For his athletic efforts while in high school and his continued support for the athletic program at Tech, he has been inducted into Tech High School's Athletic Hall of Fame. Additionally, he is an avid golfer and plays whenever he can. He is also interested in hunting and fishing and has hunted big game in Africa on many occasions.

Felson has been married to **Jane Ellen Brock-Jones**, a 1961 Tech graduate, for 44 years. They have a daughter (**Jacqueline Bowman Ponder**) and a son (**Fred Bowman**). Jackie is a practicing attorney and serves on the Center Grove School Board. Fred currently serves Solar Sources, Inc., as Vice President of Sales & Corporate Development. Felson and Jane have six grandchildren.

Duane Blankenhorn Award: Robert Book

Each year, the Tech Alumni Association awards the Duane Blankenhorn Award for exemplary service on the ATHS Alumni Board.

Robert M. Book, Class of 1948, participated in varsity football, junior varsity basketball, and Techoir while attending Tech High School. Upon graduation, Bob joined the U. S. Marine Corps. He is a Korean War veteran. When his active duty ended, Bob joined the Marine Reserves. He retired from the reserves in 1983 holding the rank of Colonel. However, he continues to be active in veteran affairs.

Bob earned a B. S. from Purdue University in Agriculture – Animal Science. He then earned a MBA from Indiana University and attended Columbia University Graduate School of Business. Bob joined ELANCO, a division of Eli Lilly and Company, in 1955. From 1966 to 1983, Bob held several different vice president positions at ELANCO, including Agricultural Marketing, Agrichemical Marketing, and Animal Products. From 1983 until 1992, he was President of the Indiana Institute of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition. Beginning in 1993, Bob has presided over AgriVista, an agricultural and agribusiness consulting firm.

Through Bob's work in the agricultural arena, he has traveled the world, representing the United States and various agribusiness concerns. His travels include Western and Southern Europe, the Mideast, Japan, Taiwan, and the Peoples' Republic of China. He also visited the U. S. S. R., Poland, Korea, the German Democratic Republic, Mexico, Central America, and South America.

Bob has served his community through various positions. These include Clay Township Board Chairman, Carmel St. Vincent's Hospital Board of Directors' Chairman, St. Vincent's Hospital Finance Committee Chair, and Republican Precinct Committeeman. Additionally, he has served as a member of the Student Selection Committee for the U. S. Naval Academy for Senator Lugar and Representative Burton. He is a member of East 91st Street Christian Church in Indianapolis.

Bob relaxes by flying, fishing and hunting. He also enjoys his four children and five grandchildren.

Karl J. Stipher Award: Frank Craig

Each year, the Tech Alumni Association awards the Karl J. Stipher Award for exemplary service to Tech High School.

Frank Craig graduated from Tech in 1960. After graduation, Frank served with the U. S. Army in Vietnam. He then attended Indiana Central College (now University of Indianapolis), graduating in 1970 with a B. S. in Secondary Education. Additionally, Frank earned his M. S. degree from Butler University in 1975. His majors have been Biology, Health, and Physical Education, with minors in Drug Education and Drivers Education.

Frank has taught Biology, Health and Physical Education in the Indianapolis Public Schools from 1970 through 2003. He worked at IPS #53 for three years and at Arlington High School for five years before returning to Tech in 1979 as a teacher and Head Basketball Coach. In 2003, Frank became the Athletic Director for his alma mater. He continues in this position today.

Some of the awards and honors Frank has received include: University of Indianapolis Coach of the Year for 1991, Indianapolis City Basketball Coaches Association City Coach of the Year for 1987, 1990, 1991, 2000, and 2001. In 1990, Frank was named State District III Coach of the Year. In 1990, 1991, and 1992, Frank was the IPS Basketball Coach of the Year. In addition, he was the IPS Athletic Conference Boys' Cross Country Coach of the Year for 1994, 1995, 1996, and 1997. In 1997, Frank was named as a Distinguished Graduate by the Tech Alumni Association.

Frank has been married to **Carole Craig**, a retired IPS educator, for 26 years. They have two children, **Joy Mason**, a scientist at Eli Lilly and Company and **Sonya Broadnax**, a clinical psychologist for the State of Indiana. Additionally, they have four grandchildren, **Miles, John, Andrea** and **Hannah**. Frank has one brother, **Alfie Craig**, who retired from Ford Motor Company. Frank is a member of Castleton United Methodist Church and the NAACP.

Besides Frank's obvious love for basketball, he also enjoys traveling, playing golf, and supporting his grandchildren in their varied activities. Frank feels extremely honored and humbled to be recognized by the Tech Alumni Association. He is honored to serve and give back to the same community that has made him what he is today.

Honorary Tech Graduate: Fred Kelly

Frederick A. Kelly, Sr. has served the Indianapolis Public Schools since 1967. He has worked with the students of Arsenal Technical High School since 1969, serving as Dean of Students. Before joining IPS, Fred grew up in Chattanooga, Tennessee. He served in the military from 1946 until 1953, holding the rank of First Lieutenant. He also was a reservist for six years. He earned a B. S. from Tuskegee University and a M. A. from Ball State University. He taught in the Chattanooga Public Schools from 1954 until 1965. He then joined the National Teacher Corps for two years, before beginning his IPS tenure at School #39.

Fred has been involved in several civic organizations, including the Pike Lions Club and Wheeler Mission. He received the Melvin Jones Award and the Past President's Award from the Lions Club. He has received several plaques and awards for his work at Tech High School. He is Member Emeritus of Wheeler Mission. Additionally, Fred is a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi fraternity, Tuskegee University Alumni Club, and Witherspoon Presbyterian Church.

Fred loves to work with his hands. He does general carpentry and arts and crafts, including sketching, painting, leather, woodworking, and jewelry. Fred has been married to **Mary Rutledge Kelly** for 57 years. They have three children: **Fred Jr.** (deceased), **Janetta**, a pediatrician, and **Katrina**, a math teacher, like her mother.

Fred has received many encouraging calls and comments regarding his work at Tech. He tells everyone he meets that he is privileged to work at Tech.
