# Thomas King ('60) named 2010 Alumnus of the Year

The Arsenal Technical High School Alumni Association is pleased to announce that Thomas A. King has been named the 2010 Alumnus of the Year. He is a 1960 graduate of Tech.

He received his Bachelor's Degree in History and Political Science from Butler University in 1966.

Since completing his education, Thomas has had a very successful professional career. He is currently serving as the interim President & CEO of the Indiana State Museum. Prior to that he spent ten years with Eli Lilly and Company where he served as President of the Eli Lilly and Company Foundation and Manager of Contributions, Community and Guest Relations. He has also served as the President & CEO of Walker Research. And he was President of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce for 12 years.

Thomas' career achievements are impressive to be sure, but he has also devoted considerable time to the Indianapolis community by serving on the board of directors of a number of organizations, including: Big Brothers of Indianapolis, Goodwill Industries, Butler University, the Indiana Sports Corporation, the Arthur Jordan Foundation, Red Cross of Greater Indianapolis, and the 500 Festival Associates.

Additionally, Thomas has been involved in some the city's most noteworthy achivements over the past 25 years. He collaborated with community leaders to determine the feasibility of building the Hoosier (RCA) Dome, and he provided staff leadership to recruit the National Collegiate Athletic Associaton (NCAA) headquarters to Indianapolis and then raised \$15 million to fulfill commitments made to the NCAA.

He is a past recipient of the Hansen H. Anderson Award from Tech, as well as an Alumni Achievement Award from Butler University and the Indianapolis Business Journal's Michael A. Carroll Award.

#### Duane Blankenhorn Award • Mary Lou Manka

Mary Lou is a 1949 graduate of Tech and spent most of her professional career serving the students at her alma mater. She taught in IPS for 36 years, the last 28 at Tech. In addition to teaching, she coached cheerleaders and the volleyball and tennis teams.

Mary Lou received her Bachelor's Degree from Butler University and her Master's Degree from Indiana University. She has served on the board of the ATHS Alumni Association for more than 25 years and is a past recipient of the Hansen H. Anderson, Karl J. Stipher and Distinguished Alumni Awards. She has one son and two grandchildren.

#### Karl J. Stipher Award • Frank E. Kendrick

Frank is a 1970 graduate of Tech and is currently Assistant Athletic Director and Varsity Basketball Coach at his alma mater. While at Tech, Frank was captain of the basketball team and was an Indiana All-Star and All-American selection. He went on to star for the Purdue University basketball team where he led the Boilers to the 1974 NIT Championship. He was also a member of the Golden State Warriors NBA World Championship team.

After his playing days were over, Frank served as an assistant basketball coach at Purdue for ten years and as head coach and director of basketball operations for the CBA Gary Steelheads. He was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2002. Additionally, he is president of Kendrick Camps, a non-profit organization that provides basketball camps in the Greater Lafayette Area. Frank is also the executive director of Y.E.S. Initiative, providing sports programs to IPS students while instilling a positive attitude toward family, learning, community life and leadership.

Frank is married with three children; Kristoff who is a JV basketball coach at Tech, Melanie who is in her second year at Wake Forest University Law School and Emiel a sophomore at IU.

#### Wally Potter Award • Gilbert H. Bierman, M.D.

Gilbert Bierman, M.D. is the first recipient of the Wally Potter Award. Gilbert is a 1951 graduate of Tech. While at Tech, he was an all-city fullback on the football team and second team all-state in 1950. He was also a starter on the varsity basketball team and a member of the marching band.

After graduating, Gilbert received a Bachelor's Degree from DePauw University and his Medical Degree from Indiana University. He completed his residency in orthopedic surgery at Lutheran Hospital in Fort Wayne. He was a self-employed orthopedic surgeon from 1964-1986 and a partner in Fort Wayne Orthopedics from 1986-1992. During his career, he performed more than 1,000 joint replacement surgeries involving knees and hips.

Gilbert is married with 6 children, 8 grandchildren (soon to be 9) and 4 great grandchildren. His enjoys music and has recorded three CDs of original and non-original songs. And in 2005, he was a medical missionary in Kenya.

#### Honorary Tech Graduate • Howard J. Catt

Howard served Tech High School from 1953-1989. First as a teacher and athletic trainer, then as a Department Head, and finally as Athletic Director for 17 years. The hospitality room in the Boys Gym is named in his honor.

During his time at Tech, Howard became one of the most respected high school athletic administrators in the state. He served as the city and IHSAA tournament director for the Hinkle sectional, regional and semi-state. He also served as the director of the boy's state tournament for 17 years and the girl's state tournament for 20 years. He received the president's award from the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 2000.

Howard Catt was born and raised in Spiceland, Indiana. He graduated from Butler University and received his Master's Degree from Indiana University. As a state licensed physical therapist, he set up the first high school athletic training program in Indiana (at Tech of course).

Howard is a lifetime member of the Indianapolis Downtown Optimists Club, served in the United States Navy from 1943-1946 and received a Sagamore of the Wabash in 1989. He has four children.
