
On June 9th (Alumni Day), we will have a Technicians show in the Auditorium, and

# **Alumni Association Awards**

## 2012 Alumnus of the Year • Luke Buck



Luke spent four years in commercial art and one year in fine art at Tech, under the extraordinary teachers, Mr. Charles Glore and Mrs. Phimister, and received a Vocational Certificate in commercial art. He also studied figure drawing at the John Heron Art Institute in Indianapolis, Indiana.

In 1970, after spending two years in the US Army as an illustrator and several years free lancing and working for Herff Jones Company, designing and illustrating rings, jewelry, medals and awards, Luke started his own business in Beech Grove, Indiana named Pro Art Studio. With the assistance of his father, Harold Buck–also a very talented artist–Luke began by providing design and illustration

for many jewelry companies throughout the country.

Pro Art Studio also became a general art center and included a custom frame shop, sold art supplies to schools and artists, and held private art classes for adults and children. They had three full-time employees and five other qualified professional art teachers with an enrollment of over 125 students weekly–and a long waiting list.

In 1982 Luke decided to go where his heart was and pursue only fine art, experimenting in acrylics, graphite and oils– but specializing in watercolor painting. What a great and successful decision that was! Luke has painted well over 3,000 paintings and won numerous honors & awards. His work has been in galleries, exhibits and private collections in every state in the nation, and in several countries abroad. Luke's work has been published through three publishers and presently with one of the leading publishers in the country, Mill Pond Press, of Venice, Florida.

Having been raised in a Christian home, Luke has a personal relationship with God and supports several organizations such as the Habitat for Humanity, the Make A Wish Program, the American Legion, the Elks Club and other civic and non-profit groups.

Luke and his wife of 45 years, Coleen (1958 Tech graduate), spend their free time on the road touring on their Harley Davidson. They have one daughter, one granddaughter and one great granddaughter.

#### Duane Blankenhorn Award • Edward Taylor & Phyllis Lewellen Taylor

**Ed Taylor** graduated from Tech in 1950. His love for Tech included enjoying all of the sporting events. While at Tech, he worked in the drafting department selling supplies and running the machinery. Keeping very busy, Ed also had a paper route and worked at a poultry farm.

Ed served in the US Army from 1955 through 1961, both on active and reserve status. In 1960, he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Education from Indiana Central College. He earned his Doctor of Jurisprudence from Indiana University School of Law in 1974. Ed also earned and continues to hold a Real Estate Broker's license.

From 1958 to 1986, Ed was in partnership with his father in a small construction company. During this time, Sears Roebuck named him Contractor of the Year in 1972. He also prepared taxes for H & R Block Company. He practiced criminal law and was a Deputy Attorney General in 1976. Ed was an attorney for the Indiana Department of Environmental Management from 1984 through 1997. He retired in 1997 as an Air Enforcement Attorney.

A past member of the Franklin Township Civic League, Ed also was president of the Board of Trustees for Acton United Methodist Church. He has also taught Sunday school and served on the church finance committee. Ed has served 10 years on the Tech Alumni Board Finance Committee. He is a former member of the Indiana and the Indianapolis Bar Associations.

Graduating in 1955, **Phyllis Lewellen Taylor** was active in the Art Club, Drama Club, Service Club, French Club, Senior Day Activities Committee and a member of the Tech Legion. Outside of Tech, she achieved the highest rank of Torch Bearer in the Camp Fire Girls, was an Honored Queen of Job's Daughters Bethel #52, Grand Librarian of Job's Daughters Grand Bethel and State of Indiana, and is a lifetime member...

After Tech, Phyllis attended Purdue University, Columbia University and Butler University. She also earned licenses as a floral designer and travel agent. She and her husband opened and operated a gift and flower shop in the 1970's. Phyllis worked for the Farm Bureau Insurance Company, retiring in 1991.

Active in civic affairs, Phyllis was a Sunday school teacher, a Brownie Girl Scout leader, president of the Acton PTO, president of the Franklin Township Homemakers Association and vice president of the Marion County Homemakers Association. She has worked as a substitute for the Perry Township Schools.

Phyllis is active in the women's Bible Study Group and the Blanket Ministry at the Acton United Methodist Church. She is a Master Knitter and member of the Pinellas County Weavers & Spinners Guild in Clearwater, Florida. Phyllis served nine years on the Tech Alumni Board as Alumni Day Activities Director and Recording Secretary.

Phyllis and her husband Eddie were married in 1958 and love to travel, spending their winters in Clearwater, Florida. They have two daughters, two great sons-in-law and five grandchildren.

#### Karl J. Stipher Award • Sylvia DeWitt

Sylvia DeWitt is the Director of Facilities & Management on the Arsenal Tech High School Campus. She has been in this position for the last five years.

While serving in this position, Sylvia has been a very busy person. She has supervised the construction and renovation of over \$70 million of work on the Tech campus. During this time Tech has renovated all existing buildings as well as added the new building called the Legacy Center.

Sylvia has worked with the Tech Alumni Association in the organization of all of its events, including the design and development of the new electronic sign at the Michigan Street entrance, which was provided by the Alumni Association. She is also completing the design and installation of the new water fountain in the middle of the campus.

Although Sylvia is originally from Angola, Indiana, she admits that she has been won over. She says her "heart is now-and will always be, with Arsenal Technical High School"

#### Wally Potter Award • Bob Book

Bob Book graduated in 1948. He played basketball two years, quarterbacked the football team for three years and was a member of the Tech Legion. Bob majored four years in agriculture and was on the Cattle Judging Team.

After Tech, Bob earned his B.S. degree in Agriculture at Purdue, his M.B.A. at Indiana University and completed a Senior Executive Program at Columbia University.

Most of Bob's very successful agriculture career was in sales, marketing and upper management with Elanco Products, a division of Eli Lilly and Company. Later he became president of the Indiana Institute of Agriculture, Food & Nutrition from 1983-1992.

Bob retired from the U.S. Marine Corps in 1983 after 35 years of Active and Reserve service, holding the rank of Colonel. He is on the Board of Directors for the Carmel St. Vincent Hospital. In May 2012 Bob will receive the highest honor that Purdue University bestows to individuals of exceptional attainment and merit—the degree of Doctor of Agriculture honoris causa.

An avid supporter of Tech, Bob served on the Alumni Board for five years (three years as president) and has received the Tech Distinguished Grad Award, Duane Blankenhorn Award, Hansen H. Anderson Award and was Alumnus of the Year in 1981.
