A Message from the Alumni Association President

Greetings from the Arsenal Technical High School Alumni Association!

For many years, Tech's Alumni Association has been one of the most active and noted high school alumni associations in the country. Let's keep it that way. Your continued support is needed, much appreciated and a wonderful way to help keep our great love and memories of Tech alive.

We need your help! Your Alumni Association needs operational funding each year for four purposes:

1) TECHNICALLY SPEAKING NEWSLETTER

We write, print and mail our newsletter, Technically Speaking, twice a year to about 18,000 graduates throughout the nation as well as a few overseas. By printing only one color, black, and bulk rate mailing, we keep our costs to a minimum. Our total cost is about \$13,500 annually. (That's less than 50 cents per alumnus).

2) ALUMNI DAY ACTIVITIES (The second Saturday in June every year)

We organize, manage and oversee all activities, including a catered lunch, Alumni award presentations and our annual business meeting in the Anderson Auditorium on the Tech campus. Our out-of-pocket costs include all alumni awards, flowers, decorations, signs & banners, printing programs & brochures and photography. The total yearly cost is about \$900. (Our cost for the lunch and any merchandise we sell is covered by our selling prices).

3) ALUMNI AWARD PROGRAMS

After finding graduates who qualify for the Hanson H Anderson and Distinguished Graduate Awards, we plan the luncheon menu, write & print programs, MC the events and take pictures for the newsletter. Our costs include the meals, awards, name badges, programs, photography and mailing. We also present academic award sweatshirts and jackets to the freshmen and seniors. Our total cost for these programs is about \$1,400 annually.

4) MISCELLANEOUS OPERATING EXPENSES

We carry insurance policies to bond the members of the Board and insure Alumni property such as the Robert Indiana art originals, Luke Buck Arsenal art, our authentic Civil War Flag, computer database and special office supplies. This cost is about \$2,200 each year.

NOTE: All scholarships and grants to Tech students are funded by direct gifts or by revenue earned from our Endowment Fund Investments. We never mingle or use scholarship gifts or Endowment Fund gifts or earned interest for our operating costs.

Therefore, our total annual operating budget is about \$18,000. This amounts to about one dollar per person on our alumni mailing list. You are our only source for operational income!

We, too, have certainly felt the pinch from our nation's poor economic conditions and will only cut back our Alumni events and activities if they cannot be funded. Please consider making a special donation to our operating fund, if you can. It's tax deductible and is vitally needed in order to keep your Alumni Association alive and active.

Duane Blankenhorn Award • Ted Vest

Theodore C. Vest, like many Techites, had very little free time during high school because he had to work immediately after school hours. After graduation in 1950, Ted started his successful career in banking at the Indiana National Bank. He remained with the bank in several positions until he retired in 1993, which was about the time that INB merged with the National Bank of Detroit.

During his career, Ted supplemented his education with many pertinent classes at Indiana Central College, Butler University and The American Institute of Banking. He also was a member of the U.S. Naval Reserves and spent about 2 years going port to port on the USS Midway in the Mediterranean Sea area and later toured the Far East as well. As he looks back, it was one of "the most enjoyable and interesting times" in his life. (But I think he loves Tech more)

Ted has been Treasurer of the St. Lukes UCC Church for 5 years, Treasurer of the St. John's UCC Men's Breakfast Group, Treasurer of the Greenwood Splinter Shop and involved in other church activities such as rummage sales and special luncheons.

For ten years Ted has served on the Tech Alumni Board as Treasurer with additional responsibilities on the Endowment Fund Investment Committee. He has done a great job and has rolled up his sleeves and been willing to help whenever an additional was needed. The Alumni Board is grateful to Ted and appreciates all his efforts and hard work.

Karl J. Stipher Award • Skip Walker

Martin "Skip" Walker, a 1950 grad, had to work all through school, but he still found time to play baseball & football as well as trumpet in Tech's Band. After Tech, Skip earned his Bachelors degree from General Motors Institute in Flint, Michigan, and his MBA from Michigan State University. He also completed the Stanford University Executive Program.

After several management positions at Chevrolet in Indianapolis, Skip rose to Director of Purchasing for the GMC Truck and Coach Division, and then to Vice President of Purchasing at the American Motors Corporation. Skip's talents and expertise continued to propel him to positions of great responsibility every step of his very successful career.

Skip then joined Rockwell International as Vice President & General Plants Manager and was named President of Rockwell's Automotive Operations five years later. After serving on Rockwell's Board of Directors in 1979, he was named Executive Vice President and a member of the Office of the Chief Executive in 1982, holding major responsibility for \$3 billion in sales and 27,000 employees. Upon leaving Rockwell, Skip joined the M.A. Hanna Company as Executive VP, a member of the Office of the Chief Executive and a Director of the Company.

Skip has continually demonstrated his love and support for Tech and his classmates for many years through the Tech Guys & Gals group, Athletic Department needs, Specific Scholarships and many Alumni Association special events and projects. Skip has been extremely generous with his time and continues to greatly impact Tech High School. He has brought much honor to Tech in many ways.
