New 'Alumni Plaza' Highlights 2014 Endowment Campaign

In 2002, your Arsenal Technical High School Alumni Association started an Endowment Fund in order to raise investment money for the purpose of "preserving Tech's rich history and traditions of excellence while promoting academic achievement for future generations of students."

The original campaign raised almost \$500,000 that has provided additional support for Tech students and teachers for over a decade. All investment income is disbursed to students and teachers through grants that are researched and approved by the Alumni Association's Endowment Fund Grant Committee.


Now it's time to move forward with a fresh new campaign. Many recent grads have been unaware of our Endowment Fund activities and opportunities. We're inviting all Tech graduates to participate in this opportunity to permanently place your name in Tech's history and help preserve Tech's tradition.

We plan to upgrade, redesign, enlarge and enhance our Alumni Recognition Area, (abutting the walkway across from the Hanson H Anderson Auditorium). This area will be a beautiful and important site for preserving names and class history for all returning alumni and their families and friends.

This new Alumni Recognition Area will be known as the 'Alumni Plaza' and will feature two distinguished brick "Towers of Honor" providing various sizes of limestone plaques with etched names and class years on them. The floor of this area will be inlaid with the same regular and larger size bricks which we currently have. In fact those existing bricks

will be reused and re-laid in their same locations. New bricks will be added as they are sold. Special green bricks will also create a large block T design in the middle of the floor.

The names etched on the glass block wall in the current Alumni Recognition Area will be re-etched on limestone plagues and attached to the appropriate brick "Tower of Honor", according to the level of the donation, at no cost. No matter what your donor level was, it will still be preserved in our new donor recognition plan without additional cost or effort on your part. Tech's beautiful tradition and academic excellence will be reflected in the design and materials for generations to visit, appreciate and remember.

The existing wooden recognition plaques hanging on the wall in the Arsenal will be updated and redone as needed too. All donor recognition will now conform to our newly formatted seven donor levels and be recognized in the Alumni Plaza and in the Arsenal building. Therefore, our new "buy a brick" campaign has started. For as little as \$200 you can preserve your name in Tech's history.

Annual Award Winners

DUANE BLANKENHORN AWARD | Judith Maxwell Coons

After graduating from Tech in 1956, Judy completed studies in insurance at the Insurance Institute of America. For over 39 years Judy was employed by American States Insurance Company. She worked as a territory underwriter for Personal Lines Insurance. In this capacity she approved and issued personal auto, homeowners, boat and umbrella policies. Through her work for American States, she helped to develop the Non-Standard Risk Department, which issued auto policies to high-risk drivers and high-performance vehicles.

Before retiring in 1998, Judy achieved several prominent positions in organizations affiliated with her life's work. She held four positions in the Indianapolis Association of Insurance Women, concluding as President from 1989 to 1990. At this time she was also named Insurance Person of the Year. Judy was President of the American States Toastmaster Club and served on the Board of Directors and Loan Officer for the American States Federal Credit Union.

Judy's civic activities include a Charter Member of the Hancock Regional Hospital Foundation Board of Directors (1981-1997), Republican Judge for a Precinct Election Board for 20 years, and State President of the AOA Sorority, which provides scholarships to nurses. She also runs Senior Bingo for a Moose Lodge. Her most satisfying experience is volunteering at the Community Hospital North's Home Healthcare Hospice.

With a wide variety of hobbies, Judy loves golf, painting, skeet & trap shooting, playing the organ, fishing and photography. She has been on 10 big game hunts in Wyoming. Most recently she traveled to Europe, Hawaii and Tanzania Africa.

Judy received the Hanson H Anderson Award in 2007. She has been on the Tech Alumni Board Finance Committee since 2005, over-seeing all Grant Procedures and interfacing with the Tech faculty.

KARL J. STIPHER AWARD | Wanda Towner Harris

Wanda Towner Harris graduated from Tech in 1948. Wanda was Tech's first majorette and she also played in the Marching Band. After graduation Wanda attended Nursing School prior to her decision to join the US Air Force. In the Air Force she attended Radio Operator's School. After serving her country, Wanda pursued a career with the airlines. She worked at the Indianapolis Airport for 27 years, with Lake Central Airlines, Eastern Airlines and the FAA. While with the FAA, Wanda became a Trainee specialist, training young people in the basic principles of air traffic control.

In 1983 Wanda left Indianapolis to be a Supervisor at the Fort Wayne and West Chicago Airports. She was promoted to Manager of the Zanesville Ohio Flight Service Station two years later. She later returned to Fort Wayne to Manage the Flight Service Station.

Wanda was one of the earliest women to become a Manager of an Air Traffic Control facility. She was later assigned to the Kankakee Illinois Flight Service Station as its Training Manager and then to Area Manager. Wanda was responsible for all of the training and the efficiency of the personnel at this facility. She retired in 1990 after 26 years in the FAA.

Wanda has a daughter who was the Manager at the Terre Haute Air Traffic Control Tower, and a daughter who works for Rolls Royce.

Wanda has served many years on the Tech Alumni Board of Directors in the extremely important position of Corresponding Secretary. She is the heart of alumni activities, being responsible for all mailing and database records. She spearheaded the campaign for the new Military Monument which was finished in 2012.

WALLY POTTER AWARD | Leslie (Les) Bryan Gerlach

Les Gerlach graduated from Tech in 1951. He played football for 4 years, a co-captain his senior year, and he also played 3 years of basketball. He was a member of the Block T Club and the Future Teachers of America. After Tech, Les attended Butler University, earning a BA in mathematics and physics. He played 4 years of football, again serving as Team Captain. He won the Most Valuable Player & Outstanding Sportsmanship award. He was President of the B Men's Club.

After graduating from Butler, Les was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U S Air Force. He graduated from the USAF Institute of Technology with a BS in Aeronautical Engineering. He then served 11 years on active duty with the Air Force. He was a transport pilot and aeronautical system engineer. He also participated in air search and rescue throughout Europe, the Mediterranean, the Middle East and North Africa. Les helped in the search for U-2 Pilot Gary Powers and a WWII B-24 Bomber named Lady Be Good.
