2016 Alumnus of the Year Peggy Berchekas Clark ('66)



Peggy Berchekas Clark graduated from Tech High School in 1966. While a student at Tech, she participated in Techoir, Majorettes, and the Red Cross Club. She was the 1966 Senior Prom Chairperson, Secretary of her Senior Homeroom and a member of the Tech Legion. She was named the top female student in Mathematics her senior year. In 1970, Peggy graduated from Purdue University with a B.S. in Mathematics. She also earned an M. S. in Secondary Education in 1975 from IUPUI and an Ed. D. in School Administration in 2004 from IU Bloomington.

Peggy taught in the Indianapolis Public Schools and Griffith Public Schools in grades 7 – 12 for 23 years. She taught at School 98, Broad Ripple High School, Griffith Senior High School, Arlington High School, and Manual High School. She served as vice-principal at Broad Ripple High School, Howe High School, and Northwest High School before becoming principal of Tech High School in 2000. In 2005, she was named Director of Intermediate and Secondary Education in the Avon Community Schools and served in that capacity until retirement in 2011. Out of the 41 years she served in public education, her fondest memories are centered on her time at her alma mater. What an honor it was to work with students and faculty at Tech! Additionally, it was always a delight to work with the Alumni Association, especially Rolla McAdams in establishing the ATHS Alumni Endowment Fund. For her efforts, she received the Karl Stipher Award in 2003.

Peggy served the ATHS Alumni Board as vice-president in 2005 through 2007 and president in 2008. She served in this capacity until 2011. Additionally, Peggy served on the 2012 Centennial Celebration Committee for Tech High School. She continues to serve the Endowment Fund Committee. Outside of education and Tech High School, Peggy was a member and the Chair of the Trustees for Meridian Street United Methodist Church.







2016 ATHS Alumni Association Annual Award Winners

DUANE BLANKENHORN AWARD | Debbi Deckard Gerlach

Debbi grew up on Riley Avenue and graduated from IPS #68 and began her four years at Tech in 1966. Her parents were apprehensive about allowing her to go to Tech, but due to her persistence they gave in - the rest is history!

Debbi immediately became active in many organizations at Tech, including SAO Board, Spanish Club, the Arsenal Cannon Newspaper staff, Quill & Scroll, Future Teachers of America and Junior Council. She performed in Sketchbook productions, was an ROTC Sponsor for 3 years, a member of the ROTC Drill Team and was crowned Military Ball Queen and Junior Prom Queen her junior year. During her senior year, Debbi served as Copy Editor for the Cannon and Recorder for Roll Room 153 and was a member of Tech Legion and the L.S. Ayres Fashion Board.

Debbi graduated from the University of Evansville in 1974 and went to work as a secretary at American States Insurance. She worked there for 12 years, leaving in 1986 to be a full-time mom to her 3 daughters, Nicole, Stephanie and Paige. Debbi returned to the workforce in 1990 as a secretary for IPS #113 for 6 years and then as the Parent Center Coordinator for one year. IPS #113 was closed in 1997, so Debbi joined the Human Resources department at IUPUI. She 'retired' from her full time position in 2014 but continues to work in Human Resources in a part-time capacity.

Debbi was invited to attend an Alumni Board meeting in 2010 by Linda Clark Hunter, Class of '64, and graciously accepted the office of Recording Secretary in 2011.

She and her husband Steve, who is also a Tech graduate, have been blessed with two adorable granddaughters, Meredith and Elizabeth.

WALLY POTTER AWARD | James Perkins, Jr.

James is a proud 1970 graduate of Arsenal Technical High School where he participated in Track, Cross country, and Wrestling. James is also a former Athletic Director of Arsenal Technical High School, where he was instrumental in the updating and remodeling of several sports programs and facilities.

He received his Bachelor of Science Degree in 1974 and has a Master's Degree in Physical Education/Sports Administration from Indiana University at IUPUI. He recently retired as the District Athletic and Wellness Director for the Metropolitan School District of Pike Township. James is a Certified Athletic Administrator and Lifetime member of the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrator tors Association.

At Pike, James was directly responsible for the strategic and successfully implemented sports plan in the township which includes Pike High School, 3 middle schools, 9 elementary schools, and more than 20 youth leagues. He also coordinated the usage and maintenance of more than 50 indoor and outdoor athletic facilities. James provided the oversight and facilitated a cooperative effort to build a new multipurpose stadium and a new Aquatic Center at Pike High School. The Aquatic Center which officially opened to the community in late February, 2016, features a 50 meter Olympic size pool and a warm shallow water training pool.

James also worked as a Sports Administrator for USA Track and Field (National Governing Body). His duties included event management of major events such as The Pan Am Games, Olympic Trials, World Championships, Olympic Games, and National Championships, Goodwill Games, Olympic Sport Festivals and The Olympic Experience, and coordination of International Teams.

Throughout his sports administration career, James has received several recognitions including the Major Taylor Award, Coach of the Year, Who's Who in Black Indiana, and a NIAAA Special Commendation Award for Distinguished Services to Interscholastic Athletics. Currently, he does special projects as President of The Perkins Approach, his consulting Company. His hobbies are fitness walking, golf, movies, and traveling. James is a strong man of faith and serves as an officer at his church. He and his wife Cynthia have five children, and four grandchildren.

HONORARY TECH GRADUATE | Gisele Dollinger

Gisele Dollinger is a proud 1982 graduate of IPS Thomas Carr Howe High School. She spent her life in their music program, as concert mistress of their symphony orchestra and as a singer in the concert choir and madrigal/swing choir ensembles. She was also concert mistress of the prestigious IPS All-City symphony orchestra. After graduating, Gisele attended Vincennes University for a year, then transferred to then-Indiana Central, where she continued singing in their concert choir.

Seven years after college, she heard of the piano accompanist job opportunity at Tech High School. Make a living playing music? Nice work if you can get it! She's been happy to be a part of the active, top-notch Tech music department for the past 26 years.

During her 26 years at Tech, Gisele has accompanied beginning choirs and Techoir concert choir. She also accompanies the Technicians show choir at their numerous community performances, representing Tech's fine music program. She is also instrumental at all-school musical rehearsals, is in charge of printing concert and musical programs, arranging bus transportation (sometimes personally driving the micro bus!) to rehearsal and performance venues, and assisting with the organization of arts festivals, IPS All-City events and contests. Her specialty is working with soloists and small groups, preparing them for musical performances, college & community theatre auditions, and ISSMA contest; several students every year win gold medals in district and state competition. She started the after-school a capella group, Titan Harmony, and encourages, sponsors, and directs student barbershop quartets. Gisele hopes to continue assisting Tech's strong music tradition for many more years.

Gisele is married to Michael Dollinger, and has three brilliant children – Marten, Lara, and Sofia, who are also all musically talented.

KARL J. STIPHER AWARD | Cindy Hartshorn

Tech has always been part of Cindy's heritage, since her mother, Glorina Anderson, was a '43 grad and bragged about it always. Cindy is the eldest of six children, five of whom attended Tech. However, in 1985, Cindy's dad, Paul E. Lewis, became the first honorary Tech graduate, in honor of his work on the IPS school board. Subsequently, her youngest sister, Beth, was issued the second honorary Tech graduate designation in honor of all her dedication and support of Tech activities her entire life. Therefore, every member of Cindy's family is a Tech graduate!

An eastsider at heart, Cindy grew up on Emerson Avenue and attended IPS #68 and #58, becoming a Tech Titan in 1966. Tech took a special place in her heart from Day One, as she threw herself into the many opportunities available here. She was a Captain in the Tech Legion, secretary of the SAO Board, senior roll room president, Editor-in-Chief of the Arsenal Cannon newspaper, and very proud member of the Techoir and Girls' Ensemble, along with a host of other clubs and activities. Cindy graduated cum laude from Ball State University in 1974, with an area music major. Her first teaching job was at John Marshall High School, where she had student-taught and was then hired as the choir director upon graduation. After JMHS closed as a high school in 1986, Cindy came home to Tech as the choral director. This year marks her 30th year at Tech!

Cindy has been married to J.D. for almost 30 years. They've been blessed with 3 wonderful children—Amanda, Adam, and Austin—who literally grew up on the Tech campus as Cindy rehearsed and directed.

During her time here, she has worked very hard to develop a dynamic music department with a variety of wonderful experiences for her students. She created the Technicians show choir during her first year at Tech, a busy group of talented young singers who represent ATHS all around the central Indiana area throughout the year. In addition, Cindy has sponsored the Gospel Choir since 1997, served as a class sponsor for 12 years, directed the Techniques all-girl group, taught beginning chorus and piano, directed the handbell choir, served as music department head for 15 of her 30 years here, and been an active and longtime member of the Homecoming Committee. She enjoyed her experience as co-chairman of the ATHS Centennial Committee in 2012, working closely with her friend, fellow alum, and colleague Beth Aubrey Meyer and past principal Sarah Bogard. Coordinating the Tech Legion has been her honor and responsibility for the past 5 years. In 1992, she became the sponsor of Tri-M, the international music honorary society, when Tech became the only IPS high school to receive a charter for membership. She has co-directed 30 all-school musicals, 22 senior musicals, 19 faculty musicals, and more than a hundred school concerts on the Tech stage.

Cindy is very proud to be a past recipient of the Hanson H. Anderson Award. She is a past winner of the IPS ABCD Award. In 2013, she received the Governor's Arts Award for outstanding arts education, and in 2014, was selected as one of four recipients of the Hubbard Life-Changing Teacher Award.
