## 2022 Alumnus of the Year William (Bill) R. Cook, class of 1962

A 1962 graduate of Tech, William (Bill) R. Cook is the Alumnus of the Year for 2022. Originally enrolled in Warren Township schools, he enrolled at IPS school #1 when his neighborhood was annexed into Indianapolis. Bill chose Arsenal Technical High School, the state's largest at the time, primarily because his dad was a Tech alumnus and doctor for the school's athletic teams. Bill had been accompanying his dad to football and basketball games since he was a small boy, and Tech felt like home despite the fact it was 7 miles from his house, and he knew no one there when he entered in 1958. While at Tech he was 2nd in his class, was president of the French Club and the SAO Board, was secretary of his Sr Roll Room, served on the Senior Council, sana in the Techoir and Madriaals, was co-commander of the 1962 Tech Legion, was a member of the Expedition to Knowledge team and the Key Club, and served as a manager and chief statis-

Bill is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Wabash College. Winner of a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship, Bill headed to Cornell University in Ithaca, New York, to study medieval history where he earned his MA and PhD. Bill's time at Wabash also included 4 years in the Wabash Glee Club. In 1998 Bill dipped his toes into national politics running for US House of Represen-

tician for the varsity basketball team. He

was a recipient of the Hanson H. Anderson

Scholarship and an Eli Lilly Scholarship.



tatives in New York's 27th Congressional District and receiving 78,000 votes. He wrote a weekly column in the Livingston County (NY) News from 1999-2019, contributing more than 1000 columns. (Editors note: There were also columns in other publications - where did he find time?) For 42 years, he taught medieval and Renaissance history at the State University of New York at Geneseo and retired in 2012 with the title of Distinguished Teaching Professor of History, From 2008 - 2010 he served as visiting professor at Wabash. In 2013, after he retired, he returned to Wabash to teach part-time for a semester. He no longer teaches regular courses but continues to teach in all sorts of ways including writing, giving lectures, consulting, and making videos.

He has won many teaching awards and is the author of 5 books and the editor of several others. Those books include Francis of Assisi: The Way of Poverty and Humility, Wipf & Stock (1989) and as co-

edition, Oxford University Press (3rd edition, 2011). Bill has directed a dozen summer seminars for high school and college teachers for the National Endowment for the Humanities. He was New York State Professor of the Year in 1992 and a runner up for the Robert Foster Cherry Award for Great Teaching (competition in the entire Englishspeaking world sponsored by Baylor University). He has made ten courses, video, and audio, for The Great Courses (formerly The Teaching Company). For the past several years, he has served as a resource more than 20 times for YPO/ WPO and CEO, organizations of leaders of companies from throughout the world. He has led many programs for Friends of Florence, a charitable organization that funds

Bill has done a great deal of traveling since retirement because he knows that a day will come when he will be unable to walk the sidewalks—a euphemism—of Yangon or be a pilgrim to Santiago de Compostela or to hike into the slums of Nairobi. Of course, he still spends a good deal of time in Europe, especially Italy. However, he has made multiple trips to Asia and Africa.

## **Centennial Museum**

If you haven't read it, a brief history of the ATHS Alumni Association Centennial Museum is in the Fall 2017 issue of this publication (http://www.athsalumniassociation.com/content/Technically\_Speaking/TS\_Fall\_2017. pdf). Since then, the museum has continued to grow and has expanded to a third display room in the Media Center. The first room is dedicated to the Civil War era and first fifty years of Tech. A sec-

ond room includes memorabilia from 1962 to the present. The third (and newest) room has developed into a room highlighting the various departments at Tech. There are many displays and scrapbooks donated from the Music Department, some of the antique balances and other equipment from the Science department, and a small loom used by one of the teachers from Tech Evening School. Scrapbooks from the JROTC department are on display in the departmental room. Everything in the museum has either been found on campus or donated by Tech graduates.

#### Some of the current displays include:


• Engraved silverware (AHS) "borrowed" from the Tech cafeteria by a 1939 graduate who returned the pieces a few years ago.



- A provisions book dated 1865. This is the oldest item in the display case located near the front door of the Media Center. This book was found by one of the maintenance staff. Both house-keeping and maintenance staff keep a sharp eye out for anything that would be of interest to museum visitors. We even have our own "dumpster diver" who has found valuable items for the museum.
- Fashions created by the students from the home economics department.
- All the available Tech yearbooks dating back to 1914.
- Books and plays written by Tech graduates and faculty members.
- Personal memorabilia donated by Tech alumni and/or their families.
- A special tribute to Fred Kelly, Dean of Boys, including his notorious paddle.
   Dean Kelly's bullhorn is still in use!!!

The museum is open (when IPS is in session) on Wednesdays from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. and will be open on Alumni Day. Special appointments can be made by contacting Sarah Bogard, Curator, at 317-371-0779. When school is in session, all visitors must check in with the security officers at the guard house and then proceed to the Arsenal to get a visitor's pass. Current volunteers who guide visitors through the museum include

Tech grads Tom Jordan 1951, Linda S. Hill 1968, Tim Schneider 1969, and Randy Wilson 1970. Monetary donations are gratefully accepted. There are assorted items for sale (posters, refrigerator magnets, snow globes, calendars, note cards, etc.) to fund museum costs.

at universities and schools in Laos and Ethiopia. However, he wanted to do more. So, in 2015, Bill established the Bill Cook Foundation, a 501(c)(3), that is raising funds to help some of the world's poorest children. The Foundation has or has had projects in the following countries: Caribbean, Central, and South America: Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama, Haiti, Guyana, Peru, Bolivia; Europe: Slovakia, Croatia, Bosnia, Kosovo (all involve Roma people); Africa: Cameroon, Equatorial Guinea, South Sudan,

Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Zambia, Zimbabwe; and Asia and Pacific: India, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam, Philippines, Papua New Guinea. In 2021, the Foundation raised about \$650,000. Its donors include a former cabinet member, the granddaughter of a US president, a winner of the Templeton Prize in Religion, the chair of the Lilly Endowment, a former member of Congress, a drag queen, and about 2000 others. It is the principal funder of the first high school for girls in South Sudan

and have built Bill Cook High School in the same town.

Bill has three adopted sons, and he served as guardian for eight other boys in their teen years.




