2023 Alumnus of the Year **Dr. Richard Storm, class of 1966**

A 1966 graduate of Tech, Dr. Richard Storm is the 2023 Alumnus of the Year. During his senior year he represented Tech at the Key Club International Convention in New York City and later represented Tech and Indiana Key Clubs at the Youth-power conference in Chicago before being selected as cowner of the Conover Award for outstanding Key Clubber in Indiana in 1966.

Following graduation from Tech he enlisted in the U.S. Army and studied fixed station electronics followed by selection for (OCS) Officer Candidate School. Upon graduation from OCS as a Lieutenant in the Field Artillery he was selected for flight school. Upon graduation from flight school he was assigned to the 1st Cavalry Division in Viet Nam as a CH-47 Chinook helicopter pilot and unit administrative officer. His tour of duty included many days as mission flight commander especially during the Cambodian Campaign. While in Viet Nam he received two awards of the Distinguished Flying Cross for heroism, 26 awards of the Air Medal, Bronze Star, and the Army Commendation Medal.

After Viet Nam he was assigned as a flight instructor at the Aviation School and then was assigned to the Field Artillery Officers career course at Ft Sill, Oklahoma. During this time he also began undergraduate studies and graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Natural Science in 1975 from Cameron University with highest honors. While at Cameron University Dr. Storm



was student president of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society and was selected in 1975 for inclusion in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities.

Prior to graduation from college he was accepted to attend the University of Chicago's MBA program and he also applied for the Army Medical Scholarship Program and was accepted to begin at the Indiana University Medical School. From these choices he decided to pursue a career in medicine and began his studies at Indiana University graduating in 1979.

Dr. Storm completed his Medical Specialty

training in Dermatology at Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio, Texas. Upon graduation in 1983 he was assigned to Ireland Army Hospital at Ft Knox, Kentucky until 1987. At that time he returned to Indianapolis as a Dermatologist on staff at Community Hospital South and St Francis Hospital retiring in 2020. Additionally, Dr Storm retired as a Lieutenant Colonel from the U.S. Army Medical Corps.

Professional Societies included the AMA, American Academy of Dermatology, American Society for Dermatologic Surgery, American Society of Laser Medicine and Surgery, Society of Pediatric Dermatology, Indiana Dermatologic Society, and the Indiana State Medical Society.

Dr. Storm has also been involved in various humanitarian projects both locally through his Church and internationally. He has been to El Salvador on several occasions participating in medical missions in villages of that country. He was on the Board of a humanitarian corporation doing service projects in Uzbekistan and has traveled to Uzbekistan on two occasions. Additionally, He has been on the Board of Regents at Midwestern Theological Seminary and currently is on the Board of Directors of Ariel Ministries and is Board liaison to the Ariel College of the Bible. He is also a Life Member of the American Legion, VFW, Vietnam Veterans Helicopter Association and the Distinguished Flying Cross Society.

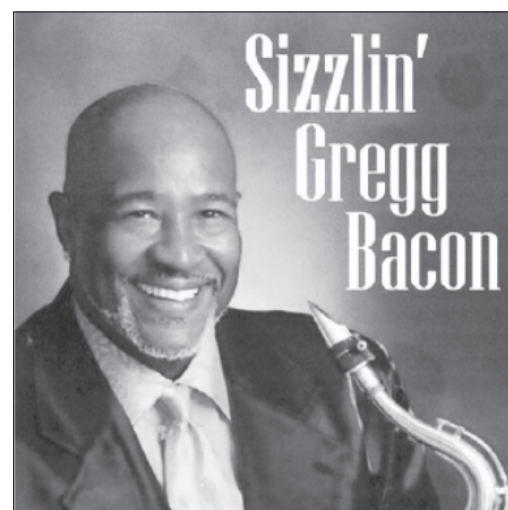
Lunch Entertainment until 3pm

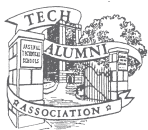

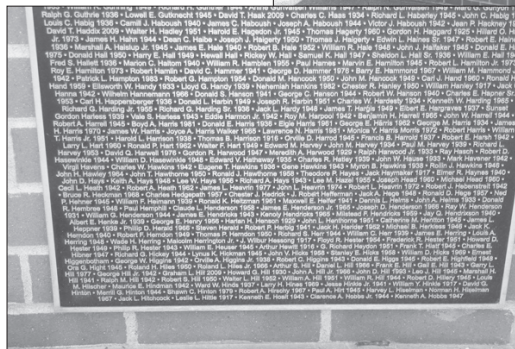
