ATHS Alumnus of the Year for 2025 **Anita A. Chambers Matthews**

This year's Alumnus of the Year is an outstanding Tech student from the Class of 1981, Anita A. Chambers Matthews. Anita, a proud product of Indianapolis Public Schools, attended Charity Dye School #27 and Harshman School #101 before graduating from Tech. She is grateful for teachers like Ms. Oakshot and Mrs. Frances Linthecome who took an interest in her at an early age and taught her the value of working hard and excelling academically. A four-year honor student, she graduated as the vale-

dictorian of her Tech class. President of her senior class, she was Co-Commander of Tech Legion and earned an honor letter sweater. She was also a member of Key Club, Athenians, and Spanish Club. She was awarded several scholarships and chose to attend Miami University of Ohio for her first year of college. She then transferred to Ball State University, graduating with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing in the top 5% of her class. While at Ball State, she enlisted in



the U.S. Army, Indiana Army National Guard. She also became a member of Delta Sigma Theta, a service sorority. In 1986, she was inducted into Sigma Theta Tau, the International Honor Society of Nursing. Upon graduation she transitioned to the U.S. Army, Army Nurse Corps as an officer. Anita started her nursing career at St. Vincent's hospital her senior year as a student nurse. She remained at St. Vincent Hospital after graduation from Ball State. There, she primarily worked

within the Medical-Surgical and Cardiology Units.

Anita's childhood was challenging. Not only did she suffer with asthma, but her mother is a chronic asthmatic. Despite her mother's health challenges, her mother continued to work, taking care, of the home, focusing on her children's education, and being present at all her children's activities. Years of observation ignited Anita's passion for medical research, fueling her aspiration to pursue a career devoted to find a cure for asthma. Thus, she transitioned to a position with Eli Lilly and Company in 1988. There she had an opportunity to work in medical research. Her initial assignment was at the Lilly Clinic focusing primarily on medical research in a clinical environment, ensuring Phase I protocols supporting various therapeutic areas were developed and executed in a compliant state as the patients were all healthy volunteers. At Lilly, she advanced to the Drug Epidemiology Unit, Medical Training, Director-Capabilities Continued on page 9

Tech Alumni Museum Update

First off, thank you to everyone who donated their Tech memorabilia to the Alumni Museum. After last fall's request for artifacts, we received a flurry of items, and we hope it continues throughout 2025. Our artifact request is simple: ANYTHING Tech related (please refer to the Fall 2024 Technically Speaking for the list of suggestions).

The volunteers recently cleaned out an Alumni storage room and brought many treasures to the Museum. Prized items include 100+ year old scrapbooks, a 7' x 4' panel of class of 1922 senior photos, and a 4' x 6' painting

of the Arsenal done by Wendrel Price ('63) that he completed in 1993 during his tenure as a teacher in the Tech Art Department. The last two items are already hung, so be sure to check them out during your next Museum visit.

In December 2024, Lisa Hendrickson and husband John Whalen toured our Museum and campus with a specific interest in seeing Stuart Hall. Lisa's grandfather, Edward Pierre, was the architect. Our main stops were the Arsenal, Stuart Hall, and the Museum. Lisa had never seen Stuart Hall or the campus. She especially loved the tower's exterior, the tower room with its beautiful murals, the sunrise/sunset window, and the bas reliefs depicting various

courses of education. Other highlights were the deco style aluminum stairwell handrails,

the ceiling fixture pointing the way to the Forum, and the Forum itself which now houses the planetarium. Following their visit, Lisa has donated several items that are now included in the Museum's Stuart Hall display. Lisa's father Robert Hendrickson graduated from Tech in 1945.

The Alumni Museum is open on Wednesdays from 10AM-2PM or by appointment (contact Tim Schneider at 707-246-5454) when school is in session. We are in the McClintock Media Center (library). Enter the Michigan Street gate and check in at the Arsenal for clearance and a visitor badge.

Alumni VP Rondell Jackson '99 donated and set up a computer, monitor, and scanner in the Museum workroom. This summer we will scan letters and documents currently on display in the Arsenal. The originals are fading badly due to sunlight exposure through the Arsenal Tower windows. The originals will be stored and replaced with duplicates in the Tower and the Museum.

On March 19th, Tamara Hemmerlein (Director, Local History Services) and Zane Cuthberton (Support Grants Coordinator) from Indiana Historical Society visited the Museum and offered guidance in a

number of areas including artifact care, display, storage, labeling, and inventory. We look forward to their continued support and guidance.

and Solutions, and Director-Biometrics Business Operations, to name a few of her assignments during her Lilly career. she holds. She provided strategic clinical quality management and oversight for Phase III and Phase IV clinical trial studies at Novartis. In doing so, she was instrumental in the FDA approval of Pluvicto, a targeted prostate cancer treatment, in the United States.

Anita served as a member of the U.S. Army Reserve, Army Nurse Corps for 23 years plus six years in the U.S. Army, Indiana Army National Guard. During her military career, she served as officer in charge (OIC) of the Medical Unit, providing medical examinations for soldiers across the entire Midwest Region. She was later appointed as the Hospital Adjutant (S1) of the 337TH Combat Support Hospital. Arsenal Technical High School Military Plaza

he Arsenal Technical High School Military Plaza is located on the south side of the Arsenal Building facing Michigan Street. The Military Plaza was originally dedicated on June 11, 2005 as a gift from the Class of 1955. The Class of 1956 added a bench the following year.

On June 8, 2013 the additional Memorial – often referred to as "the wall" – was dedicated "To Honor the Brave and Selfless Veterans of Arsenal Technical High School" as a project of the Class of 1948. Many individuals and reunion classes have contributed to continue to make this Memorial a reality. Around the Plaza there are plaques listing the many thousands of Tech students who have served our country in times of war and peace. Currently the parking for visitors is in front of the Arsenal Building allowing visitors to



walk through and observe the dignified Memorial commemorating Tech's Military Veterans.

Additionally, the Military Plaza Committee has identified eight former students and one Tech teacher who have been inducted into the Indiana Military Veterans Hall of Fame located on the grounds of the former Fort Benjamin Harrison. These include Paul Cauley, Melvin McCoy, William McGee, Thomas Montgomery, Ivan Moreman, James O'Donnell, Frederick Panhorst, Robert Pedigo and Richard Storm. Perhaps you knew some of these individuals from your time at Tech. Each year additional nominees are evaluated for induction into the Hall of Fame. The criteria for nomination is located on the Hall of Fame website, www. imvhof.com. We encourage you to nominate any Tech Veteran, student or teacher, if

they meet the selection criteria. Currently, there are at least two additional Tech alumni in the process to be nominated for the 2025 Hall of Fame Class.
